Dear Parents,

I want to welcome your family into my home. What I offer to you and your child is much more than just a baby-sitting service. I offer an extended family support system that nurtures all of us. They include music and movement, outdoor play, practical life and sensory activities, arts and crafts, pre-reading and pre-math skills, quiet story and sharing times, manipulative, dramatic play, and lots of laughter.

I strive to meet your child's physical, intellectual, social, and emotional needs. I feel children learn best in a loving, organized, natural learning environment. Your child will learn something new everyday by being a part of our extended family. Your child will learn important values such as patience, sharing, responsibility, compassion for self and others, communication, and teamwork. He will also learn the basics of education such as recognizing his alphabet, numbers, colors, shapes, and how to paint, play with dough, cut with scissors, color with crayons, and the beginning stages of reading.
